CO for honours in Psychology

Course title :Honours in Psychology

Course Description: the course is designed to introduce students to the discipline of Psychology in order to understand the human behaviour and mental processes. The aim is to maximize student's skills to decode daily life experiences and a deeper understanding of how people think, feel and behave. This course will help them to flourish their communication skills, analytical thinking, creativity, understanding self and others. This course will cover areas of General Psychology, Biopsychology, Research methodology and statistics, Social Psychology, Developmental Psychology and others.

Course Outcomes:

By the end of this course, students will be able to :

1. Decipher the different aspects of human behaviour and their implications in everyday life.

2. Know the biological basis of human behaviour and concept of individual difference in order to promote self- reflection. Moreover, the role of emotional intelligence which outranks cognitive intelligence when it comes to adjustment with the current environment and to achieve some specific goals.

3. Cope with the daily life stresses as they will learn different coping strategies, stress management techniques and techniques of behaviour modification.

4. Understand the different components of good life, factors leading to wellbeing, role of positive emotions, thought processes and traits and virtues in various domains of life.

5. Discover how physical and mental health are intertwined, the health enhancing behaviours, role of health in wellbeing.

6. Gain knowledge about the stages of human development across the life span, various domains human development.

7. Distinguish between adjustment problems and mental illnesses., Symptoms and therapeutic intervention for moderate to severe mental illness and to eliminate myths regarding psychopathology.

8. Become aware of the concepts related to organisationalbehaviour, various processes amd issues inherent in organisations related to human resources.

9. Understand the process and methods of quantitative and qualitative research traditions, different techniques of descriptive and inferential statistics for quantitative research used in Psychological research.

10. Understand the human behaviour in relation to social world, the influence of social situations on thinking and behaviour of human beings and to gain knowledge about the intervention strategies of the current social problems.

11. Learn development of psychological thought bith from the Indian and western perspectives and to inculcate sensitivity to the various issues and debates in contemporary psychology.

12. Get hands on experience of how to administer different psychological tests, experiments, studies on human subjects to assess different aspects of human behaviour: IQ assessment, Personality assessment etc.

Assessment methods:

To measure the achievement of the course outcomes, assessment methods will be used :
